Former Spiritual Advisor Celebrates Golden Anniversary


On June 15, Rev. Msgr. Larry J. Droll of Midland, Texas, marked his 50th anniversary as a priest. His St. Ann's Parish family in Midland hosted a celebration in his honor.

The Rowena native is the son of the late Harvey and Sidona Droll. After graduating from St. John's High School Seminary in San Antonio, he earned a bachelor's degree in sociology from St. Mary's University, a master's degree in theology from St. John's University, and his canon law licentiate from the Catholic University of America.

Since his ordination to the priesthood, he has dedicated himself to serving the Diocese of San Angelo. He has overseen churches in San Angelo, Ozona, and Wall and is pastor at St. Ann's Catholic Church in Midland.

From 1998 to 2006, Monsignor Droll acted as the Spiritual Advisor for Catholic Life. In recognition of his service, a scholarship was established in 2002 by Catholic Life. The Msgr. Larry Droll Scholarship Fund for the Laity provides financial aid to lay Catholic men and women pursuing a graduate degree in theology or churchrelated professions. The goal is to assist them in qualifying for professional roles in diocesan ministry.

Since its establishment, 40 individuals have been awarded scholarships totaling \$90,000. These recipients have become



leaders in various diocesan departments and serve as pastoral leaders in remote parishes.

Faith in Action

As the Church's liturgy returns us to Ordinary Time, we recall the ordinary - yet extraordinary – good news which the Apostles Creed names "forgiveness of sins." Talking about sin can be uncomfortable, but our violation of God's precepts fractures oneness with Him and calls us to make things right.

Making things right begins with our repentance, a radical change in our moral direction, turning from sin to contrition and then to renewed obedience. Jesus began His public ministry crying out, "The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel." (Mark 1:15) The Kingdom He was initiating was for all those willing to acknowledge and turn from their sin.

However, Jesus' call to "Repent" also speaks of "the gospel" – the good news of His willingness to forgive sin. When we talk of sin we must also talk of redemption – the salvation Christ won for us through the Cross, by which He has pardoned our sins, restoring us to His Father's love. The Biblical notion of redemption (as in the Israelites' Exodus from Egypt) is the process by which sinners are "purchased" from sin's bondage and given the freedom to live as God's children.

Jesus' portrayal of His Father in the parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32) reveals the nature and cost of forgiveness. When the younger son breaks from his father by demanding his inheritance to live a life of self-indulgence, he also breaks his father's heart. Squandering his father's wealth, he is eventually left with nothing. Meanwhile, unknown to him, his father grieves and waits.

When the son finally recalls his father's home and begins the journey back, he is willing to apologize and become his father's slave in order to survive. What he instead discovers is a joyous welcome and gifts symbolizing his restored status as a son. His father desires not payback but reconciliation, and despite his own sorrow and waiting, he showers his son with extravagant love.

Thus, the Creed's reference to forgiveness speaks of our Father's mighty love, which paid the price of our disobedience through the shedding of His Son's blood. This sacrifice enables us to continually affirm at each Mass, "I believe in ... the forgiveness of sins." Thanks be to God!




